"Sticky Mo & The Lionrockets" is the unique jazz quintett from Berlin that has been host of the monthly swing event called "Löwentanz" for over five years now. As their house band "the Lionrockets" have been working on their dream ever since of bringing jazz music and dance closer again. Their passion for jazz and the joy of playing for dancers lives in their music and made them create a style they call: "Lindybob". They are know for their fiery solos, sharply arranged songs and a fine repertoire that includes strange beauties as Strayhorns "Isfahan" as well as classics like "Stompin' at the Savoy" and "Broadway". They found a way to express their music by playing exclusively for dancers, including all the major social nights in Berlin such as "Cozy Balboa", "Edelswing" and "Löwentanz" as well as some other special events. All five being jazz musicians in their heart they cultivated a highly dancable swingmusic with the freedom of improvisation and pulsating interplay.

The biggest culture shock for the nature- loving boy was to be sober in the Love Parade once in the nineties. He knew that either he would never go back to the Love Parade or never be sober again. Unfortunately, he decided wrong. In the 2010s he discovered that he had overslept almost every trend of the last 20 years: Tamagochi, Soymilk, StudiVZ, Longboard, AfD and Bitcoin. Therefore, he decided to turn to the constant things and became bassist of the swing dance band Lion Rockets.

Against himself and in several classical and jazz occasions, because good colleges were always the thing that kept him motivated the most.
